

This Wednesday, we mark the midpoint of our fifty-day celebration of the Resurrection.

The Church gives us, as one of the themes in our hymnography for "Mid-Pentecost," how Jesus, at twelve years of age, taught in the Temple, His "Father's House." See Luke 2.41-52.

In this icon (from St. George, Indianapolis), we see the child Jesus seated in the teacher's chair, where He was discussing the Scriptures and their meaning with the elders, asking them questions and teaching them.

As appropriate to Him as fully human, "Jesus increased in wisdom and in stature, and in favor with God and man," yet He was also fully divine, the Almighty and All-knowing Son and Word of God, the second Person of the Holy Trinity.

Order for Holy Communion

Members of the Orthodox Church age seven and above must prepare for Holy Communion with a recent confession, prayer, fasting from all food and drink from midnight (unless a medical condition preclude it), being in church *before* the Epistle and Gospel readings, and being at peace with everyone.

Sing praises to our God, sing praises.

Verse: Clap your hands, all you nations.

Reading from the Acts of the Apostles (9.32-42; Paralytic)

IN THOSE DAYS, as Peter went here and there among them all, he came down also to the saints that lived at Lydda. There he found a man named Aeneas, who had been bedridden for eight years and was

And when he had come, they took him to the upper room. All the widows stood beside him weeping and showing tunics and other garments which Dorcas made while she was with them. But Peter put them all outside and knelt down and prayed, then turning to the body he said, "Tabitha, rise." And she opened her eyes, and when she saw Peter, she sat up. And he gave her his hand and lifted her up. Then calling the saints and widows he presented her alive. And it became known throughout all Joppa, and many believed in the Lord.

Holy Gospel according to St. John (5.1-15; Paralytic)

AT THAT TIME, Jesus went up to Jerusalem. Now there is in Jerusalem, by the Sheep Gate a pool, in Hebrew called Bethzatha, which has five porticoes. In these lay a multitude of invalids, blind, lame, paralyzed, waiting for the moving of the water; for an angel of the Lord went down at certain seasons into the pool, and troubled the water; whoever stepped in first after the troubling of the water was healed of whatever disease he had. One man was there, who had been ill

But he answered them, "The man who healed me said to me, 'Take up your pallet and walk.'" They asked him, "Who is the man who said to you, 'Take up your pallet, and walk?'" Now the man who had been healed did not know who it was, for Jesus had withdrawn, as there was a crowd in the place. Afterward, Jesus found him in the temple, and said to him, "See, you are well! Sin no more, that nothing worse befall you." The man went away and told the Jews that it was Jesus who had healed him.
