THE HOLY SEVEN SLEEPING YOUTHS OF EPHESUS
RECOVERY OF THE RELICS OF MARTYR EUDOKIA OF PERSIA

The Holy Seven Sleeping Youths of Ephesus are Maximilian, Exacustodian, Jamblichus, Martinian, Dionysius, John and Constantine, who rose from the sleep of death.

The Roman Emperor Decius came to Ephesus in 250 and led a boisterous celebration in honor of the lifeless idols. Seven young men refrained from the offering of sacrifices to idols, and they prayed to the one true God to save the Christian people. When they were accused before the Emperor, they retreated to a hill outside Ephesus called Celion and hid in a cave, and Decius commanded the cave to be sealed.

Then, God caused a miraculous and long-lasting sleep to fall upon the young men. The imperial courtiers Theodore and Rufinus, secret Christians, built in that wall lead plaques on which were written the names of these young men and an account of their martyric deaths.

After 184 years, there was a great dispute about the resurrection. At that time of turmoil, some sheepherders of Adolius, who owned the hill Celion, removed the stones from that cave. The youths then awakened from their sleep, young and healthy. The news of this miracle spread, so that now Emperor Theodosius the Younger himself came with a great entourage and happily conversed with the youths. After a week, they again fell into the sleep of death to await the universal resurrection.

We celebrate this Great Feast on **August 5/6**:

Monday, Aug. 5: Great Vespers with Artoklasia, 7 pm

Tuesday, Aug. 6: Matins, 9:30 am • Liturgy, 10:30 am

This service will be especially geared for children. Please bring your children with you Tuesday morning, while they are still on their summer breaks.

Bring with you grapes and/or other first fruits to be blessed, especially from your gardens.

We always offer to God the first and best portions of everything, and, through this first portion, He blesses everything else.

At the transfiguration on Mt. Tabor, the apostles

Peter, James and John saw Jesus resplendent in His Divine Glory, in the presence of two great witnesses, Moses and Elijah, who confirmed that Jesus was indeed *the same Light and the same God* they had beheld in his glory in the time of the Old Covenant.



DORMITION FAST CONTINUES

The Fast leading up to the Feast of the Dormition (repose) of the Mother of God runs from August 1-14.

Because of our great love for our Lord's Mother, Who has become our mother, and because our goal is to emulate her humility as the "Handmaid of the Lord," the faithful generally observe this fast quite strictly.

- We abstain from meat, fish and dairy products during this time. (Traditionally, we also abstain from oil and wine, except on the weekends.) The fasting is relaxed to allow for fish, wine and oil on the Feast of the Transfiguration, August 6, and on the feast of St. Herman of Alaska, August 9. As always, if you can't keep the fast to this level, do the most your health allows, and you are invited to discuss it with one of our clergy, for guidance.
- We serve the Paraklesis again at 7 p.m. on Wednesday, Aug. 7. Please bring a list of the names of those who are sick or who need prayer for any reason (first names of the living only, please). We will also anoint everyone present with myrrh from the tomb of the Theotokos.



- **We make our confessions** during the Dormition Fast. Our guideline is to examine ourselves and make our confessions *at least* during each of the four fasting seasons.
- We celebrate the Feast with Liturgy Wednesday, Aug. 14, at 6:30 pm.


Please join us and bring your favorite dish to serve 15 people. If your last name begins with:

TO BE READ FROM THE PULPIT AND DISTRIBUTED TO ALL PARISHIONERS

For over forty years the Children's Relief Fund has provided financial support to help defray the cost of education for children in Lebanon and Palestine. Requests for such support have increased significantly in recent years. As a result of dire circumstances in Lebanon, many parents have become unable to pay tuition to send their children to Orthodox Christian schools. Our Orthodox schools are at risk of closing, and consequently many of our children will now have to attend a public school or to discontinue their schooling altogether.

With the blessing of His Eminence Metropolitan SABA, we are seeking your help. We have approximately thirty Lebanese children from the Archdioceses of Beirut, Koura, Tripoli, and Zahle who need assistance to continue their education at an Orthodox Christian school this coming school year. The tuition cost per student varies from \$750 to \$1200 per school year, depending on the school and the student's grade level.

Donated funds will be wired directly to the Orthodox school in the child's name. The child and their family will receive a notice of your support, and you will receive contact information so that you can communicate directly with the child if you wish. Children receiving a tuition scholarship will not receive any other funding from the Children's Relief Fund. Sponsorship in any amount will be appreciated.
