HIERARCHICAL DIVINE LITURGY: HIS GRACE, BISHOP ANTHONY, PRESIDING

The Church usually remembers our Father among the Saints Nicholas the Wonderworker, Archbishop of Myra in Lycia (present-day Turkey), on December 6.

His parents, Theophanes and Nona, returned to God His gift to them—a child—by dedicating Nicholas to God. Following their repose, Nicholas distributed his inheritance to the poor, not keeping anything for himself. He especially gave gifts to poor children, so that he became popularized as "Santa Claus."

Order for Holy Communion

Members of the Orthodox Church age seven and above must prepare for Holy Communion with a recent confession, prayer, fasting from all food and drink from midnight (unless a medical condition preclude it), being in church *before* the Epistle and Gospel readings, and being at peace with everyone.
